Foreign Language Classes Under the COVID-19 Pandemic

Right before the 2020 fiscal year language classes started, a state of emergency was announced, and the April classes were postponed for one month. A month later the spread of COVID-19 infection was larger and the classes were postponed again. Even after the state of emergency was over there were some restrictions about the use of classrooms and considering the safety of the instructors and the students, we decided to cancel all classes scheduled for the first half of the year. Finally, in October 2020, we were able to start classes with a half of the capacity and shorter class period of 60 minutes instead of 90 minutes. Due to the small class size, we regret that about 80 originally registered students were not able to take classes. To avoid COVID-19 infection in classes we conducted body temperature checks and hand sanitization before each class. During the class, everyone was wearing a mask and keeping social distance from each other, and we made sure to ventilate the room properly. It was hard to give classes in such unprecedented manner, but thanks to the cooperation of the instructors and students, we happily and safely completed the latter half of the 2020 classes.

April of this year we were able to start 25 English, Korean, Chinese and Spanish language classes in Kashiwa and Kashiwanoha. Though the class capacity remained the same, the class period was back to 90 minutes, and now all classes are filled with vibrant energy. We will continue to provide proper infection control measures for the enthusiastic instructors and for the earnest students.
